Pupils and staff at Longridge Towers School celebrate recognition as one of the top performing Schools in the North East. The School is delighted that pupils' achievements in national examinations mean it is listed in the top ten Independent Schools in the North East region for the first time.

The Sunday Times Good Schools Guide calculated performance based on the percentage of exam entries at A-Level and GCSE achieving A* to B grades. The examination results reflect the strength of a broad and varied education for all pupils at Longridge and recognition of the focus on developing broader skills, strong pastoral care and creating an environment where all pupils enjoy learning.

The pupils were observed by London's 'Young Star Theatre School' owner Coralyn Canfor-dumas who praised the presentational skills of all of the pupils involved. The results reflected the hard work the children undertook over a 5 month period and they were delighted to learn that almost half of them had received distinction grade. Miss Phillips who runs the Speech and drama programme at Longridge said that this was the largest exam entrance she has experienced in five years.

She said that the pupils only seem to be more passionate and dedicated each year. The School has a very active Drama department and this year pupils are now working towards their annual Speech and Drama production 'Fright Night' to be performed in early 2018!
