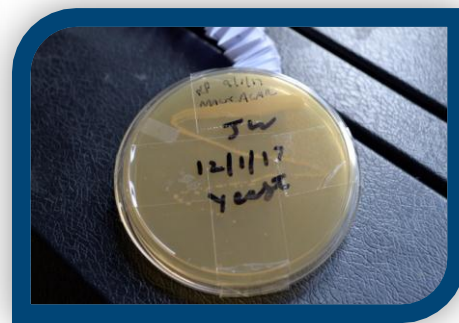
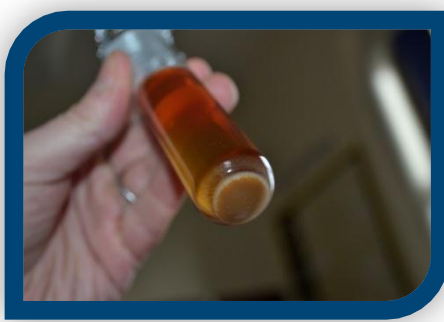
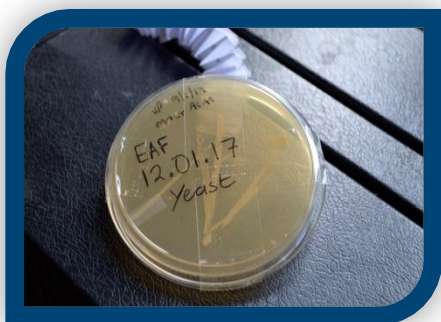

The photographs below show the results of the Form 4 culturing microbes experiment. You can clearly see the yeast streak in a zig-zag pattern. The malt broth has allowed yeast to grow and a ring of off-white yeast 'particles' is easily visible on the outside of the solid malt broth residue.
