

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Music scholarships are awarded to outstanding musicians who play any instrument or sing with exceptional ability. In recognition of this achievement Music Awards are paid by the provision of free instrumental tuition, to be given by teachers authorised by the Headmaster: such teachers provide individual instrumental tuition in the School's Music Department. The fee notes of music scholars are credited with an amount equating to the music fees on a termly basis and parents are asked to settle the fees as usual direct with the peripatetic teacher.

As you might expect, it is expected that Music Scholars will endeavour to fulfil the following:

- Attend all instrumental lessons promptly and prepared.
- Practice between lessons to maintain good progress. (Typically 1 grade per year).
- Take part in the school's Informal Concerts.
- Perform at the annual Scholar's Recital.
- Contribute to other musical activities such as playing at assemblies.
- Take part in musical activities during Enrichment and/or at lunchtimes. It is normally expected that two such activities be maintained through the year. These might include student-lead bands /groups which would be supported by staff.
- Participate in the performances that the school is involved in.

Music Awards will be reviewed each year, and may be re-awarded or withdrawn at the discretion of The Governors Awards Committee or the Headmaster on the basis that:

- Pupils in receipt of Music Awards are expected to set an example to other pupils in their behaviour and personal conduct
- Pupils in receipt of Music Awards are expected to maintain a high level of musical effort and participation in the musical life of the School.
- Any fees in respect of pupils with Music Awards will be paid by the due date
